The City strives to offer meaningful activities for all residents in Happy Valley. Throughout the year, there are a variety of gatherings organized by the City and sponsored by local businesses that aim to encourage camaraderie and celebrate the seasons. Between the signature 4th of July Family Festival where breathtaking fireworks fill the sky, to National Night Out with lively block parties attended by our local first responders, to the beloved Tree Lighting Ceremony at Christmastime, there is always something to look forward to.

Annual Happy Valley Fun Run ► May 9, 2020

This fantastic family friendly event is sponsored by Happy Valley Elementary school's PTO, with all proceeds going to support school programs.

Happy Valley Farmers Market ► April 25 – October 31, 2020

Located at the Eastridge Church on 141st and Sunnyside Road, the market is open every Saturday from 9am-2pm, rain or shine. sunnysidefarmersmarket.com

Annual Dumpster Day ► June 13, 2020

This community clean-up event at Happy Valley Park is an opportunity for households to do some spring cleaning and get rid of unused or broken items. Items are sorted and recycled, donated, or disposed of. Open to Happy Valley residents only.

Join in the family parade and then spend a fun-filled day at Happy Valley Park. Enjoy festival rides, carnival games and attractions, dozens of food vendors, live music and entertainment. Stay through the end to watch the spectacular fireworks show at dusk!

Concerts in the Valley ► July – August 2020

Experience this seven-week concert series with Portland's hottest bands. Music fills Happy Valley Park every Thursday evening during the summer.

Library Concerts in the Park ► July – August 2020

Join the Happy Valley Library Friday nights during the peak of the summer for live music at the Village Green Park.

National Night Out ► August 4, 2020

Happy Valley's award-winning community-building event focuses on fostering community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie. A team that includes police, fire, city officials and public safety personnel rotate through Happy Valley neighborhood hosted block parties.

School Night Out at the Library ► September – October 2020

Students and families are invited to a special night out at the library, featuring a behind-the-scenes tour, crafts, games and information about library programs and services just right for school-age kids. Each school from the area gets their own evening of fun!

Oktoberfest & Harvest Fest ► October 10, 2020

Celebrate all things autumn at Happy Valley's Harvest Fest and second annual Oktoberfest event at Happy Valley Park. Features traditional activities such as tractor-pulled wagon rides, petting zoo, a pie-eating contest, beer garden, Weiner dog races, family-photo opportunities, plus food vendors and seasonal treats.

Youth Town Hall ► November 2020

This event invites local high school students to attend a teen focused evening of fun, camaraderie and idea sharing as they come together to talk about issues affecting youth. The Town Hall encourages teens to get to know one another, take pride in their city and develop initiatives that will ultimately help their voice be heard.

Tree Lighting Ceremony ► December 6, 2020

Visit Santa at this annual holiday event held at City Hall. The evening includes horse-drawn carriage rides, live music, cookies and cocoa, holiday crafts, and of course the lighting of the tree. Join us for this special night of wonder.

WE CAN'T WAIT TO MEET YOU

When Happy Valley was established in 1965, the City's two original staff members held meetings and carried out their daily work in the space now occupied by Sunrise Water Authority. When workload increased and there was a need for more space, the City purchased the house across the street. It belonged to Ed Rebstock, a longtime resident who was often referred to as "Mr. Happy Valley" to those around town. He was granted the nickname because of his generosity and integral support in helping shape the City in those early days. The Rebstock House served as City Hall from 1986 until 2009, when the new building was constructed. Today, City Hall houses nearly 50 of the City's employees and offers stunning wood, stone and exposed beams. The building was built to be LEED certified, maintaining the tradition of enriching the community while preserving the environment.



The Rebstock House, which is located at 12915 SE King Road, is currently home to Happy Valley's Community Policing Center.
